Construction starts on Queensland's first FamilyLinQ integrated school-based hub at Kingston State School

The first sod has been turned at Kingston State School to mark the start of construction on Queensland's first FamilyLinQ hub.

The Bryan Foundation was proud to participate in the special event alongside Queensland Treasurer, Minister for Trade and Investment and Member for Woodridge, Mr Cameron Dick, who officially represented Education Minister Grace and was joined by The Bryan Foundation's Executive Director, Matthew Cox and Chair, Jill Simes.

Due for completion in late 2023, the FamilyLinQ hub will play a central role in school community life, providing safe, welcoming and inclusive spaces with a clear focus on improving health, educational and life outcomes for children and their families.

Services available at the hub will be tailored to meet community needs and will incorporate; health, family support, quality educational resources, early childhood support and services, adult education and training and community activities.

Minister Dick said it's a great project for our community and for Queensland. "This is going to be transformative for the families who live in and around Kingston State School and for the local community. It brings together health, education and other services in a facility that will be open, welcoming and will help improve and transform lives."

"FamilyLinQ is an exciting new initiative that brings together the best of government education, health, philanthropy and community partners to support the wellbeing of Queensland kids and their families," said Matthew Cox, Executive Director of The Bryan Foundation.
